

Extra! Extra! Read all about it from the director!

Welcome to the theater! Our show takes place in the year 1899, and the world you're about to experience is a world very different from our own. The internet, and everything that comes with it, has completely changed the way we take in news. Some kids today aren't familiar with newspapers at all (read that sentence again). So, I imagine that an ongoing internet crash, a power outage, or a worldwide tech disaster would be a catastrophe on the same scale as a Newsies strike. No Newsies, no news.

Although I've always been a big fan of the story of Newsies and the inspiring "kid power" it portrays (I was raised on the 1992 cult classic movie), I had some doubts if the young actors would be able to relate to the story. Many of the challenges the Newsies faced aren't imaginable in today's society. I knew the dancing would be exciting, and the music energizing. But the story? How could we relate to the incredibly high stakes caused by the newspaper distribution price being raised?

It wasn't until the question was posed to the actors, "Can you imagine hearing something that would change your life in an instant?" that it all became relatable. The discussion was effortless as we rattled off the affects of the global pandemic: "Masks until further notice. It'll only be two weeks. You're going to be homeschooled until further notice. There's a global pandemic, and life as we know it is changed forever." The comparison helped the cast understand how seriously life can be affected by one disastrous piece of news. It helped me as a director, too. I've wondered how the students would cope with such a major digression from normal life. It's clear to me now. Getting to move, sing, emote, and develop together is the opposite of the isolation and challenge that the pandemic caused. Against the social and emotional whiplash of the pandemic: Theatre is our strike.

I'm enormously proud of this cast. I've seen them work so hard to bring this story to life. From auditions I knew we had a stellar group, loaded with talent. But the stamina they've created in this high-demand show is something very special. Not many shows require its cast members to give as much as this one does. The reward they'll feel is probably similar to the feeling of, say, winning a strike. I consider it their personal victory. Camaraderie, moving their bodies, friendship, and raising their voices, all serve as important reminders that their lives are very much not shut down. This cast has proven they've got a beautiful life to seize right at their fingertips. As musical theatre always seems to remind me: "Wrongs will be righted if we're united. Let us seize the day."




