Director's Notes

WE ARE BACK! I am feeling a little shaky, because this return was never guaranteed. It has been a year of following the news, making decisions based on the reports, only to watch those decisions become meaningless days later as the news evolved. We were flexible, and when that wasn't going to be enough, we worked to be more nimble. Eventually we learned to be downright acrobatic. Thanks to a lot of mental and budgetary gymnastics, we are here and we seem to be on our feet. We are determined to stick the landing. We have not done this alone, although we felt very alone for moments at a time. I think everyone did. But, ultimately, it has been the community that has brought us through. You may not even realize your contribution, but you did this, and we will continue to prevail, with your help.

It's a little hard to remember now, but even before the pandemic hit, we lost our rehearsal/performance space at the Annex in January of 2020. We were thrilled to be given a two year stay in studios at the Highline Performing Arts Center, and then, disappointed when those studios at the PAC got absorbed into active use by the builders during reconstruction of the high school. But, who needed studios anyway? Students and cast members joined us online! Of course, as you can imagine, it was only a fraction of the participation that we normally experience. During our monthly Zoom meetings, the Board of Directors stared gloomily at a budget that projected our first deficit since 2009. As we headed into 2021, the possibility of closing the doors by the end of April loomed.

So, how did we make it? Hi-Liners are keeping Hi-Liners going. People sitting in this room donated money every time they could to help sustain us. Some of you brought your kids, or even yourselves, to virtual classes and shows presented in ways we had never imagined. Very brave Hi-Liners joined the board at the most challenging moment in HMT history and brainstormed, strategized, and toiled to keep the doors from closing. Paid positions from video editing to teaching, costuming to stage combat, have been transformed to volunteer roles as artists who believe in the mission of this theatre lend their time and talents so that we can operate on a shoestring. HMT friends found us a stage and studios for the summer theatre camps that will help bring us back. Parents in this room got their young performers to online auditions, pulled costumes out of their closets at home, and then bought tickets to support their growth. You did this. You are doing this.

What happens now? We are determined to present a complete season this year. After consistently producing MainStage since 1994, we have been dark at the PAC for two summers in a row. In order to bring MainStage back, we have kept expenses to a minimum and begun to chip away at the deficit, which has already been reduced by 1/3. We are working on securing a venue for our school year programs and planning an exciting new format for our November fundraiser. We are staying nimble.

But let's focus on what we have already accomplished. As the curtain call happens tonight, give those performers a hand, and then look around and include the entire room in your applause.


Parent Notes


